1776. Kentucky organized as a county of Virginia.

1780. 8000 acres of land granted by Virginia for a Seminary of Learning.

1783. Land Grant increased
Later $\frac{1}{4}$ of Surveyor's fees added

1785. Transylvania Seminary founded at Danville

1789. Transylvania Seminary moved to Lexington
1793. Lexington made the permanent location.

1794. Presbyterian Academy founded at Pisgah

1798. Transylvania University formed from Transylvania Seminary and Presbyterian Academy.

1836. Bacon College founded at Georgetown
1839. Moved to Harrodsburg
1850. Ceased operation

1857. Kentucky University, Harrodsburg (Reorganized Bacon College)
1859. Began work

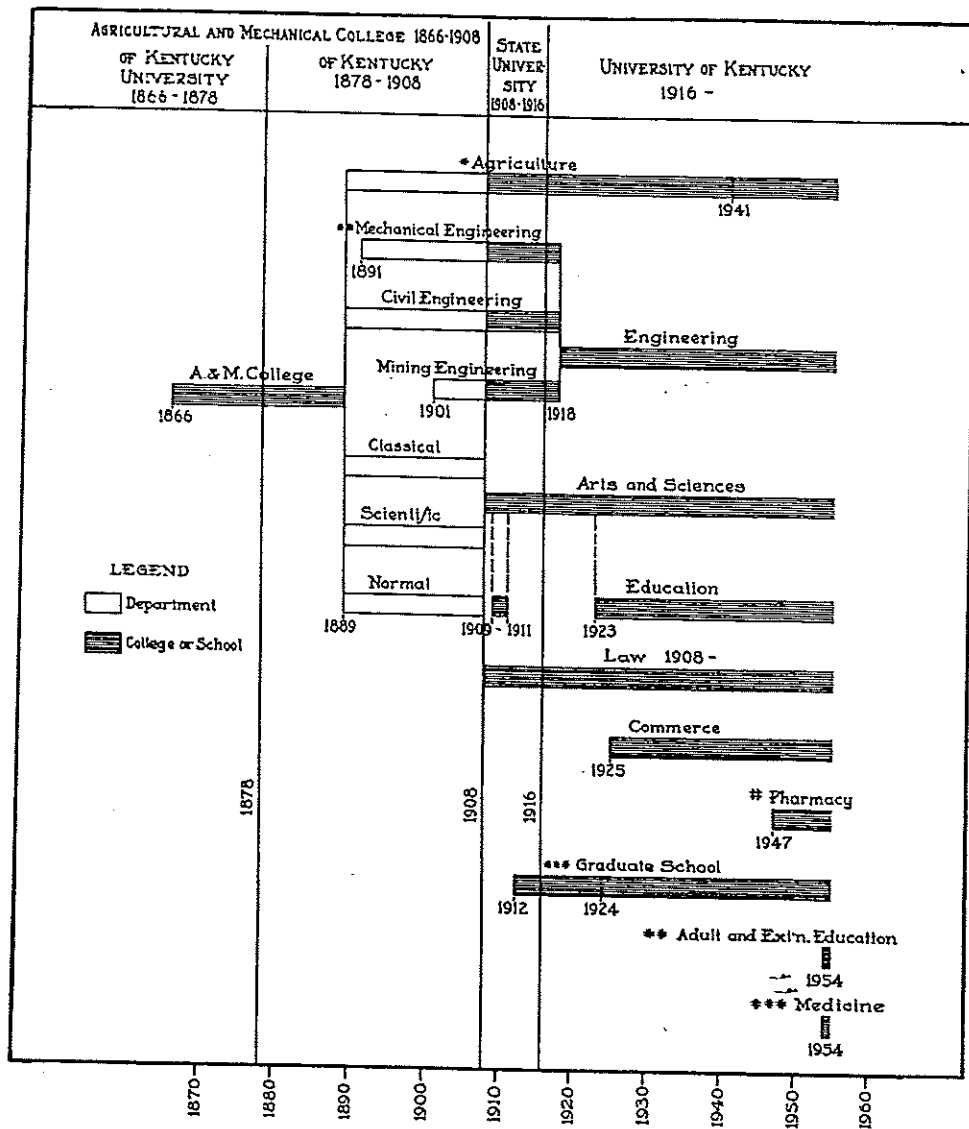
